Mr. Cronkite's wisdom and vision of preparing our youth as future leaders in their communities gave rise to this special event. His inspirational work and unwavering support will remain in the hearts of many around the world. We celebrate his place in our lives, his words of encouragement, and the remarkable man who shared a common goal for a better tomorrow.

The Stone Soup Leadership Institute's mission is to develop educational tools, trainings and initiatives that prepare young and emerging leaders to build a better world. Founded in 1997 on Martha's Vineyard, the Institute is a 501c3 non-profit education organization registered in Massachusetts. Walter Cronkite wrote the introduction to the Institute's book and educational curriculum, *Stone Soup for the World: Life-Changing Stories of Everyday Heroes*. In 2000, the Institute presented its first Celebration of Heroes Awards Ceremony with Walter Cronkite to honor local heroes from each of the Island's six towns. Kathy Cronkite serves on the Institute's International Advisory Council, carrying on his father's legacy.

The Martha's Vineyard Youth Leadership Initiative's mission is to develop the next generation of leaders. MVYLI's year round programs include MVYLI's Job Shadow Day, College Prep Program, Governor's Youth Council, Cape & Islands Youth Congress, NAACP Juneteenth Conference and Bioneers by the Bay Conference. Walter Cronkite Award Winners

Meagan McDonough is junior at the Martha's Vineyard Charter School and a founding member of the Martha's Vineyard Youth Leadership Initiative (MVYLI). Her dream is to educational media producer. She feels strongly about the need for positive educational media, especially to inspire young people. Meagan served as a delegate to the Institute's 6th Annual Youth Leadership Summit for Sustainable Development. Born on the Caribbean island of St. Thomas, Meagan enjoyed meeting youth delegates from five Caribbean islands as well as Martha's Vineyard. For the last year Meagan has been MVYLI's intern at the Martha's Vineyard Community Television Station (MVTV). She produced a video on MVYLI's College Prep Program and Field Trip and MVYLI's Job Shadow Day. Meagan traveled to Boston with MVYLI youth to present the MVYLI Sustainable Vineyard Map to Senator John Kerry's staff and on the local ABC-TV station. Meagan served as MVYLI's representative to the Cape & Islands Youth Congress where she shared her perspective about the importance of giving young people an opportunity to share their ideas with their communities and the world. Meagan is a hard worker with a great spirit and an enthusiasm for life that is contagious. She is an original, open-minded young woman with a strong sense of values.

Len Morris is the director of Galen Films that produces social documentaries with a focus on children's human rights. Over the past fifteen years, Len and his team have produced a trilogy of films that focus on the causes and best practice solutions to child labor, children on the streets and chronic poverty: *Stolen Childhoods, Rescuing Emmanuel and The Same Heart*. Len is also an advocate for children before government agencies, on campuses, at conferences and through his participation in a unique online community, **MEDIA VOICES FOR CHILDREN**. Len is a Member of the Directors Guild of America. He began his career producing public radio, and was a film editor and producer at ABC News, 20/20. Len is an independent producer and director of documentary films, videos and oral histories (of world leaders in government, business, academia, philanthropy and the arts). Len's films have been broadcast on ABC, NBC, PBS, HBO, TNT and AMC and broadcast around the world. He has produced and directed all the Galen Films productions on this site. An advocate for children before Congress and internationally, Len's speaking engagements range from universities to global conferences. Len was the director of the Stone Soup Leadership institute's video narrated by Walter Cronkite, *In Celebration of Heroes*.



In 2002, Walter Cronkite hosted the Institute's Global Heroes Awards Event in New York City to honor those on the front lines of the war against poverty and terrorism. He presented Dr. Muhammad Yunus, Grameen Bank with the Institute's Mahatma Gandhi Award. At the event, Walter Cronkite challenged leaders from business, government and the global NGO community to take this pledge.
